6. Local Neighbourhood Centre

EF presented update on development, including provision of retail at ground level, with 43 x social housing properties, managed by Hightown Housing (an existing provider on Phase One).

EF confirmed that Co-Op are confirmed grocery retail provider, with a further x3 units awaiting occupation.

EF noted that road between

Neighbourhood Centre and Thornhill

School will be bus only access,

controlled by ANPR cameras.

Centre scheduled to open in Spring

2026.



7. Green Park (subject to name change)

EF updated on progress with Green
Park, outlining the new features,
including a new bandstand, Multi Use
Games Area (MUGA), playing fields and
continuation of the strategic cycling
route.

EF shared plan to give residents the opportunity to vote for their preferred name for the new park and inviting residents to the opening ceremony in Spring 2026.

EF noted that there is no provision for parking, at the new park, as residents and visitors will be encouraged to walk or cycle.

8. Allotments update

EF confirmed the remaining allotments are being prepared for release imminently. Those residents who have registered for an allotment will be given first refusal, before any remaining allotments will be released.

EF confirmed the annual tenancy charge will be £120 for a full site and £60 for a half-site. These charges will apply to all new and existing tenants and are subject to VAT.



EF / MG confirmed that training will be on offer, through the Land Trust 'Green Angels', scheduled for 13 November 2025.

EF to share tenancy agreements and payment links to approved tenants.

Details of spare allotments will be released once awaiting tenants have secured their sites.

This has been done and available on the website.

9. Land Trust updates General – hosted by Marlen Gray (MG)

MG provided a status on new contractor,
Nurture, and progress on ongoing
management of shared spaces,
cleanliness, retrieval of rubbish and
ongoing repairs.

MG noted that new team had taken some time to acclimatise, and progress was being made, with close management, including Monthly KPIs.

MG encouraged residents to contact the Land Trust through email or the ZenDesk feature on the Land Trust website, assuring every enquiry will be responded to.

13. AOB	Residents around Silver Birch explained
	frustrations with parents parking for
	school. This was also causing access
	issues for bus routes joining Silver Birch
	into Box Crescent. EF noted that the
	road will be adopted by Central Beds
	Council (CBC) and there weren't plans
	for any specific parking controls. EF also
	noted that Linmere has offered The
	Farmstead Car Park for parents to 'Park
	& Stride' into school on scooters, but
	uptake was poor.
	Residents enquired on permanence of
	current bus stops, noting that current
	stop on Silver Birch wasn't ideally
	placed. EF noted that stops are
	temporary whilst financial viability of bus
	routes are evaluated by CBC and bus
	operators.
	EF confirmed there are no plans to
	introduce CCTV to park areas.
